## All dolled up for spring

Discover the history and beauty of Hina-Matsuri, the Girls' Doll festival

Every year on the third day of March, Japan observes Hina-Matsuri, known in English as Girls' Day or the Doll Festival — a day to pray for the continued growth, health and happiness of the nation's girls and women. And it is an annual tradition that we celebrate at Keio Plaza Hotel Tokyo

This year, from February 1 to March 26, we will be exhibiting our tiered stand of dolls, called a hinadan, in the 3rd floor main lobby to give our guests from around the world the opportunity to learn about Hina-Matsuri and experience its beauty first-hand. On this large stand sit exquisitely made dolls of the Emperor and Empress, ladies in waiting, and musicians, representing the court of the Heian period (794-1185 AD).

On the top level, the Emperor sits next to a vase of cherry blossoms on the left, while the Empress sits next to branches of orange blossoms on the right. This arrangement reflects the ancient

Imperial Palace, which had cherry blossoms on its west side and orange blossoms on the east. The display is also garlanded with peach blossoms, symbolizing the start of spring. Every year, it is a popular photo spot for guests and visitors, and this year will be no exception, with eye-catching artificial flower displays on either side of the hina-dan.

Visitors and guests alike are sure to enjoy our unique display of more than 6,000 hanging ornaments, each one handmade from kimono and quilt fabrics exclusively for our hotel. These small dolls are said to possess their own particular attributes to protect girls from evil spirits or bring good luck or blessing in different areas of life. These decorations are hung from a height of 3.3 meters around the *hina-dan*, enhancing its colors and elegance.

Join us in our annual tradition by being part of this festival of gratitude for the girls and women in our lives.

As part of our exhibition, we are also showcasing flower-themed works of art that reflect the calm and beauty of spring.
